

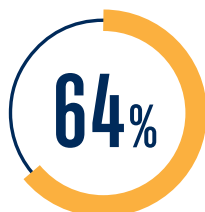
IS CALIFORNIA FAILING SENIORS? VOTERS SAY YES

A majority of Californians say the next governor and lawmakers – with the input of expert stakeholders – must develop and implement a master plan for aging.

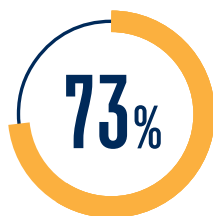

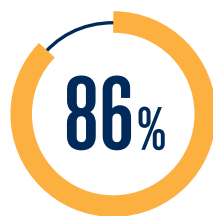
Feel it is important for California to have a master plan to invest in services that allow seniors to age in place

Survey was conducted from June 8, 2018 through June 11, 2018 and consisted of 1,000 registered voters. Interviews were conducted in English and Spanish, and across mobile and landlines. Survey sample was stratified and has a margin of error of +/-3.1% (95% confidence interval)
